





Steps for Hosting an Author Visit



Brainstorm: Think big picture. What is the goal of the author visit? To excite students about reading? To kick-off Read Across America Week? Which students will experience the author visit? When will the author visit occur?







Author Visit: Game day! Take pictures and invite your district's Public Relations person or local media. Enjoy all your hard work!

*Examples of Enrichment Activities

- Art Project related to amusement parks, or a Welcome Banner for David
- Classroom Read of David's first book (a Discussion Guide is in each book with questions and activities), then students write Book Reviews
- Create Your Own Mystery worksheet (email David for this)
- Brainstorm questions to ask David
- Research Waldameer & Water World or David via their websites
- Creative Writing Worksheets provided on David's website, under Resources







Bulk Book Orders

Schools ordering books through David will receive a discount.

Normal Price: \$11.99 + tax

School Price: \$9.00 + no tax

(Shipping fee applies if the school wants their order shipped)

Bulk orders should be done in advance, as David may need to order more from his publisher to meet the quantity requested. Bulk orders can be shipped to the school, or David can deliver the books on the event day or before if nearby to Richmond, Virginia.

To place a bulk order, please email David. He is happy to provide a quote or invoice to your school's finance secretary!

Book Sale for Students

Schools who have booked author visits are able to host a book sale of David's books for students and their families. This sale occurs prior to David's visit.

• Normal Price: \$11.99 + tax

• Student Price: \$10.00 (tax included)

The school distributes David's purchase flyer to families, then uses David's spreadsheet to track sales. Schools collect cash to give to David. David writes personal autographs in each book and delivers the books when he comes for the author visit.

David has found that book sales increase students' excitement and anticipation for his author visit. Parents become more familiar with David's work as well.
